The mission of St. David's Episcopal Preschool is to provide a joyful, enriching learning experience that will develop a love for learning and a sense of security that will last a lifetime.

We welcome children ages 16 months–5 years. The classes vary in days, according to age. While we are not a daycare, we do have options so most children can be with us from 8:30 a.m. until 2:00 p.m., Monday through Friday.

What will your child learn in our fun, safe, and loving environment?

- Social Skills with peers and adults



- Self-Esteem through Preschool Chapel lessons, independent decision making, and age-appropriate responsibilities
- Language Skills through conversation, daily reading, alphabet, Handwriting Without Tears
- Phonemic awareness through games and programs like Recipe for Reading
- Fine Motor Skills through tracing, cutting, pasting, painting, writing, planting
- Math Skills matching, sorting, measuring, counting, and patterning
- Science Skills through experiments and cooking
- Gross Motor Skills through music and movement class as well as outdoor activities
- Foster Imagination through make-believe, picture books, and free play

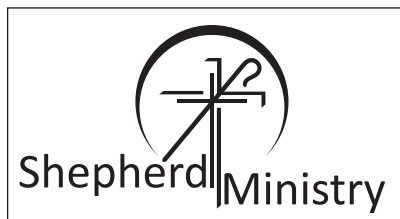
Above all, we believe that each child is sacred, special, and unique.

Our indoor Playspace is home to our Music and Movement class, our Before/After school playgroups, and our special child friendly "Parent's Morning Out", and "Parent's Night Out".

We value security and safety for our students. The outer doors to the building are locked and video monitored. There are intercoms connected to the preschool office at building entrances and in each preschool classroom.

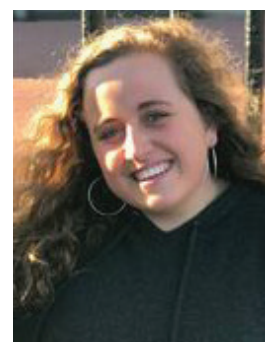

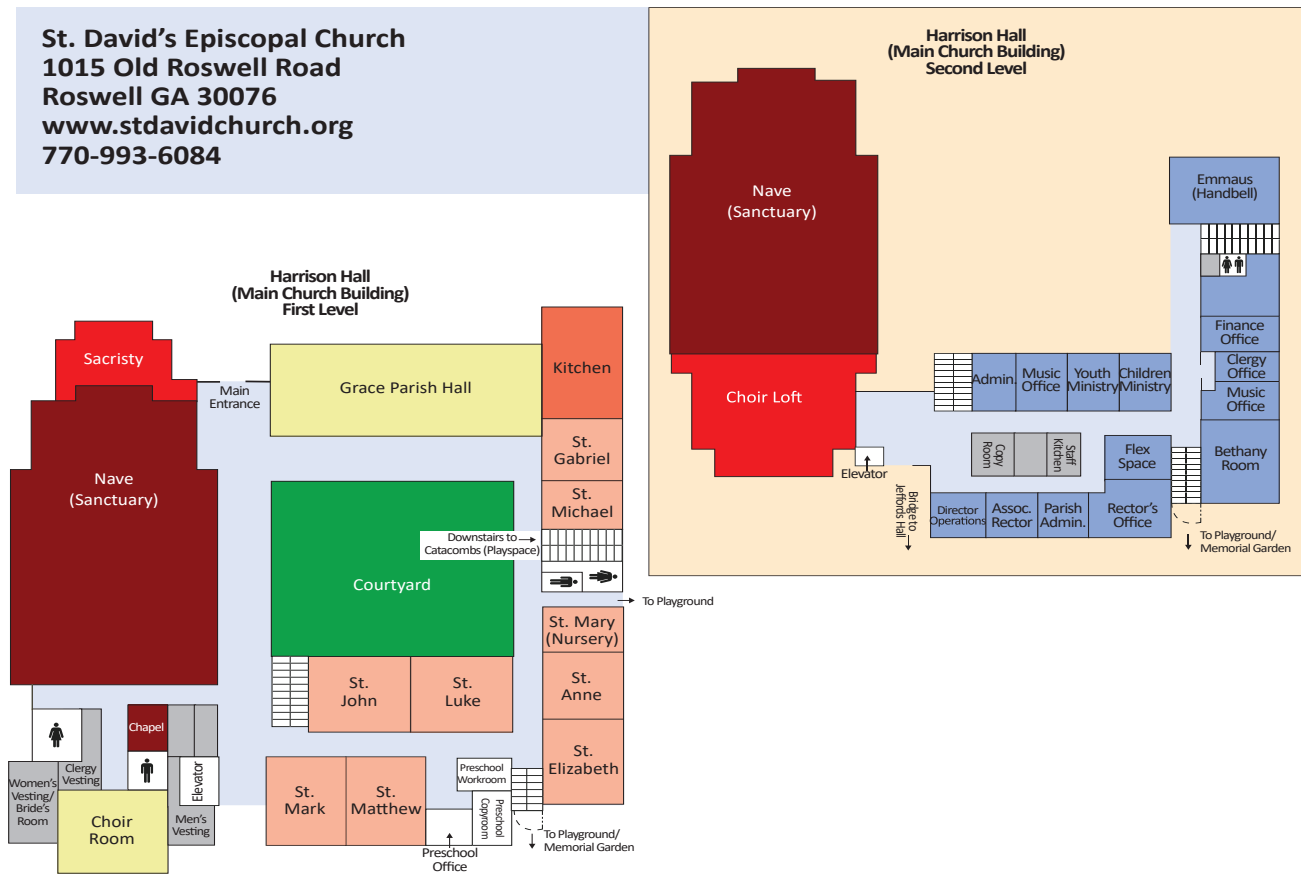

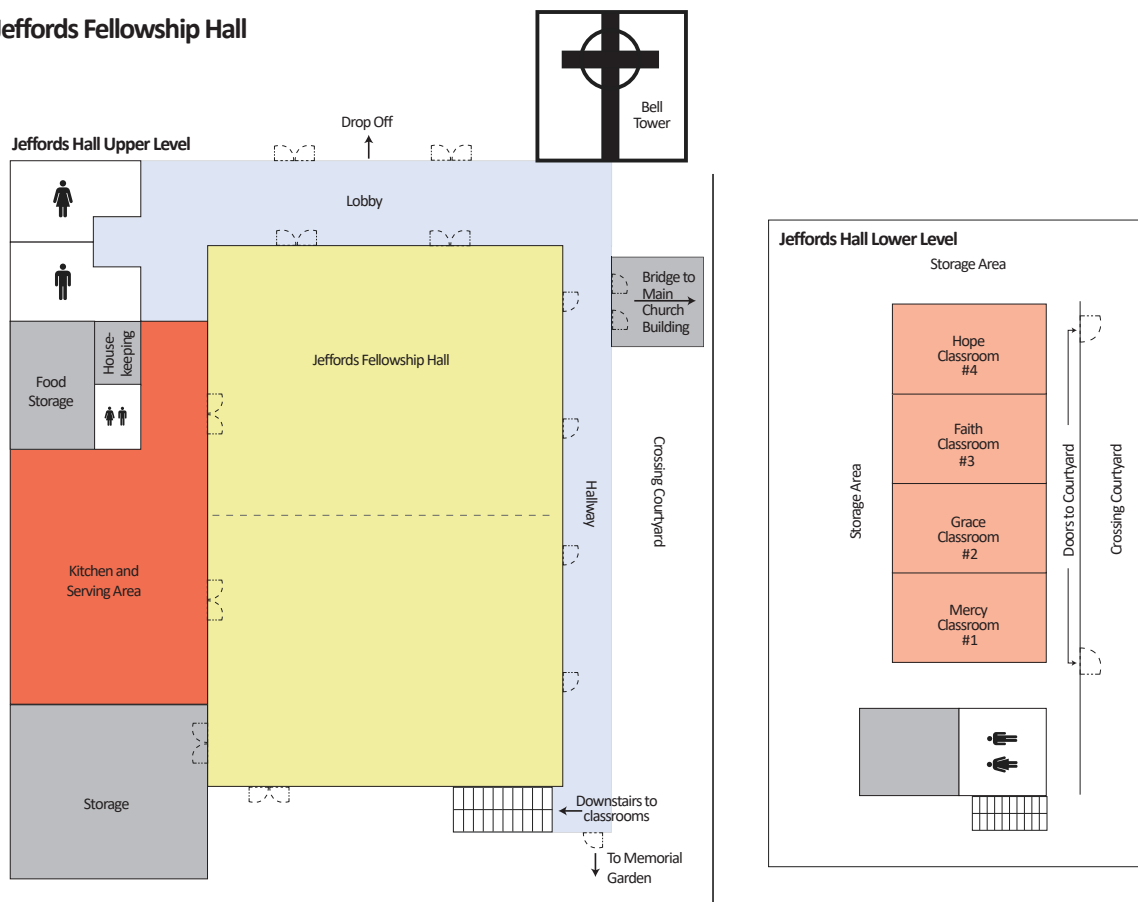
